I would love to see our graduates characterised by three qualities: Incarnational Leadership, Redemptive Purpose and Missional Community. Last week in the King's Ken, I spoke about Redemptive Agency and this week we're looking at Missional Community. It implies a fellowship of believers characterised by love for one another and for Christ, who intentionally reach out to outsiders, to the broken and lost of our world, to the marginalised, with the purpose of winning them into the fellowship. It is never insular, or polarising, but always outward-looking and service-orientated.

Our best antidote against the societal ills of tribalism is to raise young men and women who will choose a path of missional community. They will form bands of

believers who will be known by their love for one another, and who will go out into the streets to find and heal the broken. Ann Voskamp asks this telling question: **"Why do we rush to defend God to a broken world, and not race to defend the image of God in the world's broken?"**

As a parent, will you pray that our children will let their hearts be broken for the lost? And Lord, help us as adults to model a lifestyle of "crossing over to the other side" as modelled for us by the Good Samaritan.
