#### **OBSERVATIONS FROM ACSI ACCREDITATION TEAM CHAIR**





Hello! My name is Brian Bliss. Last month, in September, I made my first visit to TKSWR. The visit was part of preparations for the upcoming ACSI re-accreditation visit in February.

I travel quite a bit and have visited many Christian schools in Africa, Europe and Asia. Spending two days at TKSWR was great! Getting to visit your campus and stop by a number of classes, listening to the programs and community of schools that you serve, and meeting and visiting with a number of your staff left me very encouraged. What stood out to me was the priority given to attributing and proclaiming GOD as the source of all Truth and Knowledge. There is no course, class, or subject without God's fingerprints all through it!

Some years ago, when I was a Christian school director, there was a knock at my door. A mother of two of our students was there. Inviting her in, I thought, "I wonder what problem I'm going to hear about now?" Before I could even ask, the mother said, "I just wanted to come by and say Thank YOU! My children love this school. As a mother, you don't know how much that means. My children have been in many other schools

and have never been excited to go to school each day!" For a few moments, no response formed in my thoughts. I was still processing what I had heard. I played it over and over audibly in my mind. Suddenly, realizing my lack of response, I blurted out, "OH that is WONDERFUL! Thank you for coming by to tell me this. You have made my day!"

Sometimes what we consider "ordinary" is actually quite extra-ordinary! I was recently challenged hearing the following: "What if I only had today what I gave thanks for yesterday?" In your TKSWR community take a moment; recognize the extraordinary around you. Make someone's day today (a student, a teacher, a parent, administrator, anyone!) at TKSWR and tell them "Thank you!" and what you are thankful for. They may have a response like mine...speechless. But the smiles and encouragement that follow are priceless!

You have seen that education is not only about passing and failing. In fact, if anything, it is more about the failing than the passing because it is from our mistakes that we learn.


You have made the space in your classrooms and in your teaching to help our Class of 2019 reflect on our mistakes, learn from them and possibly be humbled by them.
