The King's School West Rand will provide a graded, progressive and age-appropriate educational programme which will produce students who:

1. ...are well-prepared in all academic disciplines. (Academic)
2. ...use their God-given gift of creativity to imagine and apply redemptive solutions to real-world problems. (Skill)
3. ...embrace learning as a lifelong joyful activity that is forming who they are becoming, and who maintain a growth mindset in this shaping process. (Formation)
4. ...accept that their work is a calling and consider it as worship to God. (Worldview)
5. ...can explain how their Christian worldview differs from opposing worldviews. (Worldview)
6. ...actively pursue a deepening personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ and commit to practising regular spiritual disciplines to grow their faith. (Formation)
7. ...extend themselves to engage in critical thinking, deductive reasoning, inferential thinking and problem-solving, and are not simply passive learners who focus on memorising facts and reproducing content in tests. (Academic)
8. ...exercise a thoughtful stewardship of God's creation, and what he has entrusted to them in their time, finances and other resources. (Skill)
9. ...understand that none of their learning content is value-neutral, but that all curricular material has God-given meaning and can be purposed (or repurposed) for God's glory. (Academic)
10. ...regard life as sacred, value all diverse people as created in the image of God and actively seek inter-racial unity by "crossing over to the other side". (Formation)
11. ...love God's community of faith and actively seek fellowship with other Christ-followers including opportunities for corporate ministry. (Worldview)
12. ...value and engage in appropriate community service, with an emphasis on promoting justice, mercy and peace-making. (Skill)

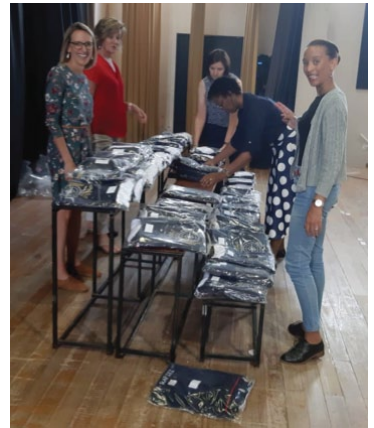
