From the Principal's desk

In this pandemic, there is a sense that we are all in limbo, a time of waiting. Waiting for the virus to go away and for old routines to return. But I feel that the Lord is saying to each of us, "My child, I have work for you in this time." Here are 4 things I believe God is calling us to right now.

Firstly pray for the other families in the school. Many days you will not know exactly what to pray and how to pray, and then you must pray "with groanings too deep for words" (Romans 8:26). For you this might be praying for them in a 'heavenly language' (in tongues), or it might be a case of lifting them up to God, ushering them into his presence, and crying out to him on their behalf (Our churches teach differently on this but the Biblical exhortation is simply to seek to pray in accordance with God's Spirit).

Secondly, pass the peace of Christ to those that God has given to you in your community. There is so much anxiety around at the moment, and as believers we share this message of Christ with one another: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27). See https://www.reformedworship.org/art icle/march-2011/passing-peace for a practical way of doing this.

Thirdly, be generous as Christ instructs. This generosity might not be with money, but could be with your time, your service, your words of kindness or your sacrifice. "For we must always cherish the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, who taught, 'Blessed are those who try to give more than they've been given'." (Acts 21:35b, Passion Translation, as translated from the Aramaic).

Lastly, realise that the words you speak to others are also words that you speak over them. This is a scary time that we are living in and our anxieties can cause us to lash out with our words. The Bible instructs us to let our conversation be always full of grace and seasoned with salt. Let us follow Christ and not the world which is so full of outrage culture and shame culture. The way of Christ always builds, the way of the world always breaks down.

God has pressed these 4 things on my heart for us as a family together, and I urge us all to respond in unity. We have work to do.

My Child has COVID-19

This last week has been quite a bit of a rollercoaster ride but one of hope and healing amidst some worry and fear.

Our son, Jadin, first complained of a little bit of a headache Monday evening, the 20th of July, before going to bed. I didn't think much of it and thought maybe it was all the close work during the day or some dehydration. At around 12pm midnight he called me and complained his head was really sore. He had a high temperature of around 38.5. One thing we have learnt from our house Doctor was not to give Neurofen as it is not a good combination if there is a chance of a Covid-19 infection. Rather use paracetamol like Panado or Empaped suppositories to bring the fever down quickly, so stock up on these.

We took our son to the Doctor and had him tested which came back positive.

He presented with a few symptoms over the next 3 days: stomach ache, a sore throat in the mornings, visual disturbances (seeing black or blurry for a few seconds), muscle pains (like his calve muscles), strange taste of food, tiredness or feeling weak. He did receive some antibiotics but mostly it was medication to treat symptoms. We were all put on extra Vit. B, C & D as well as Zinc. Keep stock of these too.

After these 3 days, the symptoms started to subside and he was doing much better. We as parents both tested negative but we are still isolated and hope and pray that we will stay healthy. So far we are both still fine.

Firstly, İ am just reminded of what a powerful system our immune system is and how it was made by our Father to function and fight infection. All we should do is live a healthy lifestyle and supplement to support this powerful system to function optimally and let it do its job.

Secondly, we know as believers that He has not given us a spirit of fear but one of power, love and a sound mind. 2 Timothy 1:7

Rather than fear the worst, pray and trust in the power of a God that has given us His Spirit of peace. Philippians 4:6-7.


This is our godly immune system against all of Satan's attacks which comes in many different forms through living in a broken sinful world.

Hygiene Guidelines FOR SWOP SHOP/2nd HAND SHOP

Guidelines for the management of the swop shop/2nd hand uniform shop, based on the principles set out by the NCID in the control of Covid-19

- Surfaces of the shop to be cleaned with household detergent, then disinfected applied to surfaces before the shop opens.
- All surfaces, including floors to be disinfected at the end of each day that the shop is open.
- Gloves to be used when cleaning the surfaces and handling soiled clothing items. Proper personal hygiene to be followed before and after the use of gloves. Correct disposal of gloves to be followed.
- Parents accessing the school grounds will be required to follow the access rules as set out by the school.
- Alcohol-based hand sanitiser to be used on entry to the shop.
- No mask No entry policy to be enforced.
- Maximum of 2 people to be allowed into the shop at any given time.
- Minimum social contact and a safe distance of 1,5m between customers
- Parents advised to please bring their own bags or packets.
- Parents are requested to please wash any items brought in for exchanging.
