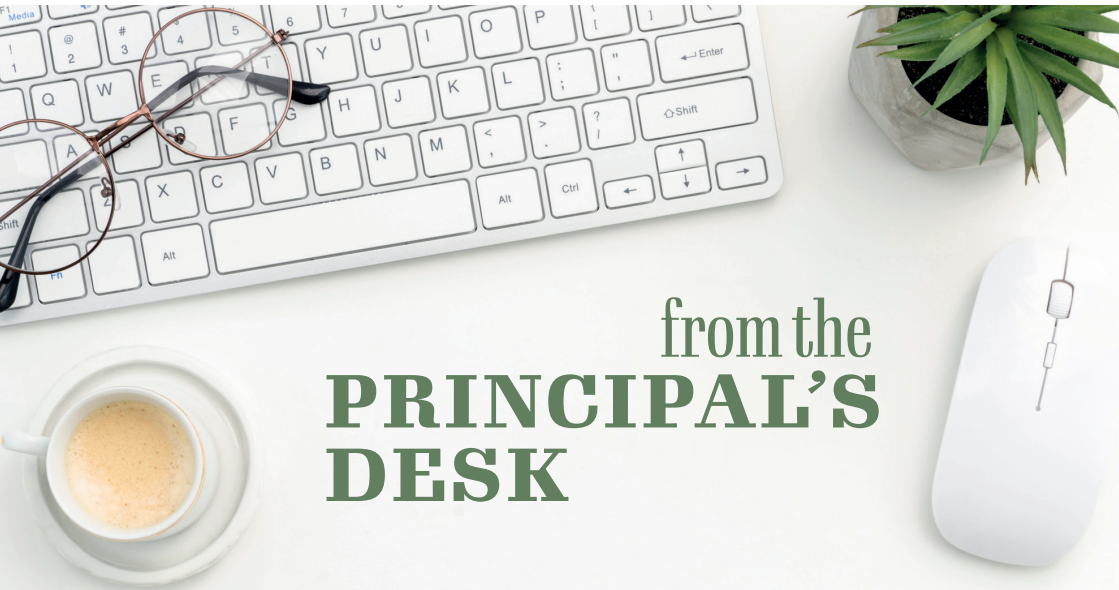

from the **PRINCIPAL'S DESK**

At The King's School West Rand we are committed to maintaining a good standard of discipline. Our desire is to always shape our students through discipleship/mentoring rather than through punishment for inappropriate behaviour. The end goal of the discipleship approach is to develop self-discipline in students, while the end goal of the punishment approach is to ensure compliance to school requirements regardless of whether the student embraces the school's standards or not.

We believe that the self-disciplined student will never require discipline and that is why we prefer a discipleship approach.

As parents we ask that you support the school in developing self-disciplined students that will

1. Be on time for school.
2. Be on time for class (no loitering after break).
3. Meet their deadlines for homework or assignments.
4. Fulfil the school's uniform and hair regulations.

5. Listen actively in every lesson and be prepared to contribute to the learning process.
6. Own up when they make a mistake, rather than hide away, make excuses or shift the blame.
7. Be involved in sport or cultural extra-murals at the school.
8. Stay positive and not lend their ears out to gossip or negativity.
9. Respect all teachers at the school and be prepared to assist them where they can.
10. Stay on task in lesson time - the Bible says there is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the sun - lessons are times for work and not for unstructured play.

Every year when we reflect back on our Matric students' results, we clearly see that self-disciplined students are the ones who achieve the best results. Let's all work together to develop this self-discipline, it will bear fruit for every student in every season of their life.
