The one thing they do not get to do is to put them on themselves for the first time. We as their teachers reserve this right and we save it for a special occasion.

We use the story of Elijah in 1 Kings 19 where God tells him to go and anoint Elisha as his successor. Elijah does this by throwing his cloak over Elisha while he is working in the fields. Elisha follows Elijah and sees him doing God's will and then when it is time for Elijah to leave earth, Elisha asks Elijah for a double portion of his anointing. The Message translation puts it in such a beautiful picture in 2 Kings 2:9: Elisha said,

"Your life repeated in my life. I want to be a holy man just like you." So we as teachers help our Grade 12 learners to put on their jackets for the first time with the wish that God's blessing and work in our lives, be repeated and magnified in their lives. We pray with them and it is a glorious celebration at the beginning of the ending of their High School journey.

After this the Matrics get to help their Grade 8 buddies put on their blazers for the first official time in the High School with the same blessing and wish for them. We also remind them of how God opened Elisha's servant's eyes when they were surrounded and scared in 2 Kings 9. Elisha asked God to open his servant's eyes so he could see God's angels in chariots of fire surrounding them to protect them. This is our wish for our Grade 8 learners. That they will seek refuge with God but also run to a familiar face – a matric buddy- when High School life gets too much for them.

We want all our learners to be part of our culture and to be proud of who we are. They should wear their school uniform with pride and remember that we represent the King of Kings. Our prayer is that our jackets and blazers will be a symbol of God's cloak of protection for all his children.

Please note that learners are working weekly on their Art project in class. The teacher will notify learners when it is due.

A What to study" will go out at least one week before all Prepared assessments (Class Tests and Cycle Tests). It should be pasted or written in the homework diary. All marks are captured on ADAM after an assessment is written (1 week turnaround time for tests and 2 weeks for Projects)

All Cycle Tests are written on a THURSDAY except for the 5th March when we will write on the Tuesday, due to it being CAMP week. Please arrive earlier on those days (Before 07:30).

Non Prepared assessments will also be written as decided by the relevant subject teacher. (Learners don't study for these as they are skilled based)

Projects must be handed in on the due date. Failure to do so will result in 0% for the late submission of the assessment for the term. Resubmission of this assessment is compulsory and the mark achieved with the re-submission will be taken into account the following term. The June Exam timetable will be issued later in Term 2.

In the case of Absenteeism:

A doctor's certificate, must be handed in on the first day back at school. Failure to do so will result in 0% for the task for the term.

Protocol for Rainy Days before 12:00

Grade 1 - 5:

Where possible a decision will be made by no later than 12:00 to cancel OUTDOOR activities. In cases such as these most Parents have sufficient time to make arrangements to collect their children at the end of the school day. However, ALL staff who are team managers are required to remain on duty for the duration of the specified OUTDOOR extra mural and look after the children who have not been collected from school by the end of the school day.

A WhatsApp message will be sent to the HOD's of the Foundation Phase and the Intermediate Phase notifying them of the cancellation. The HOD's will then forward that message on the WhatsApp Parent Groups.

The Sports and Recreation Officers will notify external coaches, medics, cancel transport and catering requests and communicate with the Receptionist with regards to the whereabouts of the children.

Protocol for Rainy Days after 12:00

If it starts raining after 12:00 and there isn't sufficient time for Parents to collect their children after school, ALL staff who are team managers are required to remain on duty for the duration of the specified OUTDOOR extra mural and look after said children until the parents collect them. Sports and Recreation Officers/Team Managers will inform the Receptionist of the whereabouts of the children in their care so that Parents can easily locate their children.

Grade 6 - 12:

OUTDOOR Extra Murals will NOT be cancelled regardless of the weather. Team Managers and Coaches need to be prepared to deal with classroom sessions on wet days. Team building, team strategy and game play discussions etc. will be held during this time.

Attendance by players on these days is still a requirement for Team Selection. Normal team protocols for absenteeism will be followed.

Learners in these age groups may be collected after the extra mural ends in accordance with the Extra Mural Timetables.
