This journey of nurturing a prayerful attitude in our children is one we share.

Together, let's guide our children to find strength, wisdom, and solace in prayer, equipping them to face life's trials successfully. Ask them what they are learning at school about prayer, and share with them your experiences.

Let's unite in this significant mission, striving to raise a generation that deeply understands the power of prayer and faith.
