BE THE DIFFERENCE Written by Gabby Henry (Gr9 LRC)

In Mark 2:2-11, we encounter a story that beautifully illustrates the power of faith, determination, and the impact of being the difference in someone's life.

The scene is set in a house crowded with people eager to hear Jesus speak.

Among the crowd are four men carrying a paralyzed friend on a mat, desperate to bring him to Jesus for healing. The house is so packed that they cannot get through the door, but they refuse to give up. Preserving through the obstacle, they climb onto the roof, make an opening, and lower their friend down to where Jesus is teaching. Their boldness and determination are rewarded when Jesus, seeing their faith, says to the paralyzed man, "Son, your sins are forgiven." This statement causes a stir among some religious leaders present, who question Jesus' authority to forgive sins. To demonstrate His authority, Jesus then commands the man to get up, take his mat, and walk home, which he does, to the amazement of everyone watching.

This passage highlights the importance of being the difference in the lives of others. The four friends did not let the barriers stop them; they saw a need and took action. Their faith wasn't passive; it was active, driving them to find a way where there seemed to be none. They didn't just wish for their friend's healing—they made it happen by doing whatever it took to bring him to Jesus.

In our own lives, we are often faced with situations where we can choose to make a difference or stand back. The story of these four friends challenges us to take action, even when it's difficult or inconvenient. Being the difference means stepping out in faith, finding creative solutions, and sometimes going against the grain to help those in need. Moreover, Jesus' response to the situation teaches us about the deeper needs of those around us.

While the friends sought physical healing for their companion, Jesus first addressed the man's spiritual need by forgiving his sins. This reminds us that being the difference isn't just about meeting immediate, visible needs but also about caring for the deeper, often hidden, aspects of a person's well-being. In a world that often prioritizes self-interest, the example set in Mark 2:2-11 calls us to be the difference by acting in faith, compassion, and perseverance.

It encourages us to not only bring others closer to healing and wholeness but also to break down barriers that stand in the way of true transformation.




MATHS STAR


