Throughout Mark 2:2-11, we see how faithful God is, even through the most unexpected situations.

When Jesus sees the faith of the people who brought the paralyzed man, He declares that the man's sins were forgiven. DIFFERENCE. To imitate Christ and in doing so, we help others and bring glory to the name of Jesus.





Nathan Nemusombori (Grade 5) – He got first place at the Westrand Chess Trials (U12) on 07 September 2024.


