Dear Parents,

At The King's School West Rand, we believe that teaching our children to receive correction is an essential part of their growth and development. This lesson is rooted in Scripture and is vital for nurturing a spirit of humility and resilience in our students.

Proverbs 12:1 (AMP) tells us, "Whoever loves instruction and discipline loves knowledge, But he who hates reproof and correction is stupid." This verse highlights the importance of embracing correction as a means to gain wisdom and understanding. When children learn to accept guidance and feedback, they open themselves to opportunities for growth and improvement.

Correction, when given in love, provides our children with valuable insights into their actions and decisions. It teaches them to reflect on their behavior and consider how they can make positive changes. As parents and educators, it is our role to offer correction with kindness and patience, ensuring that it is constructive and supportive.

C.S. Lewis said, "Failures, repeated failures, are finger posts on the road to achievement. One fails forward toward success." As we guide our learners, let us emphasize the value of humility and the willingness to learn from others. Encourage open discussions about the lessons that come from correction and how these experiences can strengthen their character.

Together, let us instill in our children the understanding that correction is not a sign of failure but an opportunity for growth. By embracing this mindset, they will be better equipped to navigate life's challenges with wisdom and grace.


